Why do we need a fellowship?

- To develop and improve our skills in an area of research
- To create an environment for future academic work
- To get experience in running a project from the beginning to the end (design project/protocol, run experiment/clinical trial, wrap up results and write manuscript)





Why do we need a fellowship?

- To understand better science so we can improve our patients' treatments and prognosis
- To develop a successful academic career

BUT first, list your aims and objectives and where do you want to be in 5 and 10 years!



How to find a fellowship... and make the best of it!



Application process: steps

- Question # 1: What are the new and important areas of research in oncology? What are my areas of interest?
- Tips: talk to colleagues and ex fellows, talk to Pls, attend conferences and workshops.
- Question ≠ 2: Do I have the skills to be successful in the chosen area?
- Tips: if you have a passion for a topic and background... work hard and learn more!





Application process: steps

- Question ≠ 3: Where should I go?
- **Tips:** Look for a program (hospital/ cancer center) and mentor (an expert in your area of interest)
 - ESMO fellowships
 - ASCO fellowships
 - National Societies
 - Philanthropic institutions
- Question ≠ 4: how to find a good mentor? (Really important!)
- **Tips:** The mentor should guide and train you, be an expert/leader in his field.

Application process: steps

- Question ≠ 5: How do I start the paperwork for a fellowship application?
- Tips:
 - Keep your CV in good shape
 - Develop a good project proposal
 - Apply for funding
