Objectives

- To support the training of young oncologists by organising educational activities and offering grants which provide candidates the chance to gain hands on experience in first class European institutions
- Create a cadre of young medical oncologists prepared to meet the challenges of daily oncology practice
- Develop vital collaboration between institutions
- Recognise excellence through ESMO Awards.

ESMO Educational Fellowships

Translational Research Unit Visit- Term 4-5 Day

- 8-10 fellows per each visit
- 3- 4 times per year
- 1,000€ grant to each Fellow
- 1,000€ paid to the Host Institute

Clinical Unit Visit – Term 6 weeks

- Minimum of 6 fellows per year
- 5,000€ grant to each Fellow
- 1,000€ paid to the Host Institutes

Palliative Care Fellowship – Term 1 – 3 months

- Minimum of 3 fellows per year
- 5,000€ grant for research fellowship
- 2,500€ grant for observer fellowship

ESMO Research Fellowships

Translational Research – Term 1 – 2 years

- 2-4 fellowships per year
- 35,000€ grant to each Fellow (1 year) further grant of 35,000 for 2nd year on approval
- 1,000€ paid to the Host Institute

Clinical Research – Term 1 year

- 1 fellowship per year
- 35,000€ grant to Fellow
- 1,000€ paid to the Host Institute

Georges Mathé Translational Research – Term 1 year

- 1 fellowship per year
- 35,000€ grant to Fellow
